Fredonia, KY Grave Markings of Three Patriots

A little over a year ago, Scott Giltner first laid eyes on the grave of one of his Patriot ancestors. Don Boone, owner of the property where the cemetery is located, said "The expression on Scott's face was worth a million dollars." The writer believes that Mr. Boone was almost as excited as Scott to find Patriots of the Revolutionary War buried on his property. Boone, Scott, Dennis Scott and about thirty patriotic citizens scheduled a couple of work days and had the cemeteries (yes there were two cemeteries) spic and span for the ceremonies to honor three Revolutionary War Patriots.

Community leaders got involved and local newspapers ran stories about the schedule event. Over 200 people showed at the Boone Farm to honor the Patriots. Wagons drawn with mules transported the crowd to the cemeteries. Our chapter was assisted in the ceremony by members of the Lt.
