Bob Bynum, Reggie Roberson and John Test are ready for the parade to start. Thanks to the Chilton Group for providing the flat-bed truck for the parade.



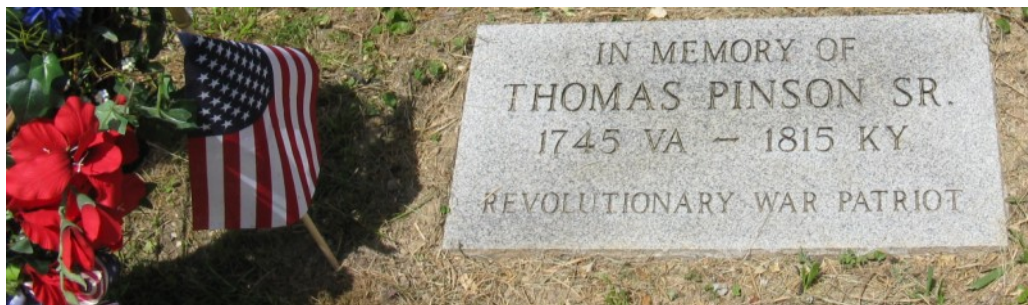

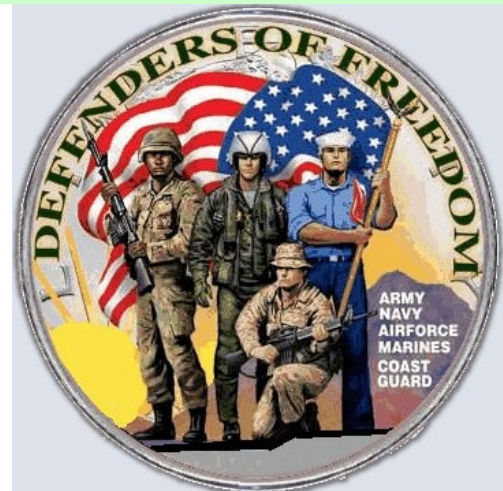

Scott Giltner is working on a special project--compiling a list of World War II Veterans who attend his church. More about this project in a future newsletter.

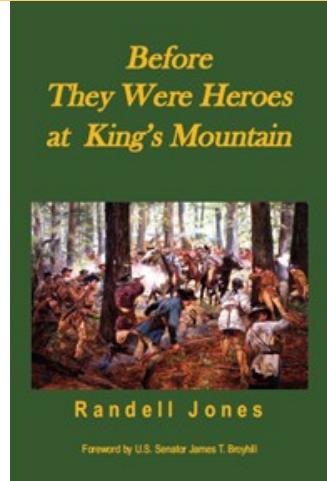
## Randell Jones to speak in Shelbyville

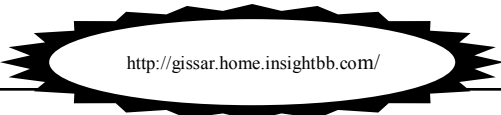
