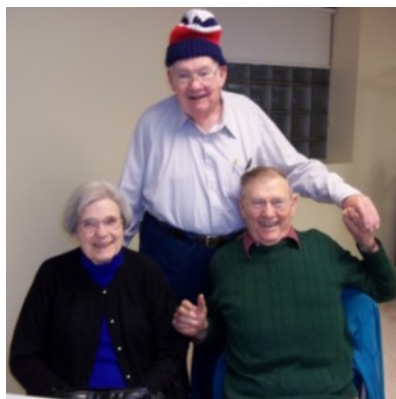

Reggie has accumulated about 100,000 "Service to Veterans" points making him one of the tops in the nation in this category. Forrest presented Reggie with a silver oak-leaf cluster to go with the medal and gold oak-leaf cluster already earned. He was also presented with the Liberty Bell award for his continued work with the Veterans. Reggie collected and delivered books and personal items, over the last several years, to five V.A. hospitals in Missouri, Kansas and Oklahoma. Reggie was also awarded the Meritorious Service medal--the highest award a chapter can give.
