Mike is an Army veteran of two one-year deployments with Operation Iraqi Freedom. His physical injuries are from having his armored vehicle nearly blown up twice by enemy ordnance. His major wounds are ones that cannot be seen, and helping with them is the specialty of Seal Team. The Doberman Pinscher is trained to help Mike cope with constant issues of post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and traumatic brain injury (TBI). Mike's challenge, like thousands of returning veterans, is to learn to live with his very real but unseen injuries. With the aid of Shelly and now Seal Team, he works toward becoming a productive member of American society.
